# Porcelain kaolin clay and fire

The beauty of Limoges porcelain and the skill required to make it are simply fascinating. What makes Limoges porcelain unique is its whiteness, translucence and its finesse. Its reputation, a combination of tradition and modernity are unmatched. It originated with the discovery of kaolin clay in Saint-Yrieix, in the south of Haute-Vienne, in 1768. Limoges porcelain is a subtle mixture of minerals and it is mostly used for tableware. It symbolizes "Art de Vivre" on the tables of presidents, royalty and ambassadors around the world. Today, designers keep the art of Limoges porcelain alive with remarkable contemporary pieces.



### **ESPRIT PORCELAINE**

Esprit Porcelaine is an internationally renowned collective of porcelain designers and artists who create tableware as well as indoor and outdoor decoration. They combine porcelain with wood, glass and other material and are in the forefront of contemporary porcelain creation. Nowadays, enamel is associated with contemporary material thanks to young designers who create original and unusual works of art. The Enamel House in Limoges is dedicated to contemporary enamel art.



## THE FINE ARTS MUSEUM IN LIMOGES

The museum is set in a majestic building which used to be an Episcopal Palace, by Limoges cathedral in the Saint-Etienne medieval quarters of Limoges. It was renovated in 2006 and 2010.

It is internationally renowned for its enamel collection. It offers a wide panorama of Limousin enamel production from the 12th century to today ("champlevé" enamel, Renaissance painted enamel, modern and contemporary enamel), as well as pieces from all over the world.

Don't miss the museum's paintings by Renoir and Valadon, sculptures, Egyptian antiques and the exhibit about Limoges's 2000 year old history.

The themes she approaches are graphic research taken from photographs, references to the historical aspect of her trade and art, and a glance at our society. Her gallery, located on Louis Blanc boulevard, opened in 2007. It is both a showroom and a workshop where her art is exhibited along with pieces by many other artists and craftspeople. The atmosphere is immaculate and pure, with various decorative objects, jewellery, lamps, furniture, sculptures and paintings, staged and regularly renewed by Lise Rathonie.

The « JM Weston » brand was created by the Blanchard company which was founded in Limoges in 1891. Blanchard specialized in deluxe shoes. In 1904, Eugène Blanchard travelled to Boston to learn new techniques from « Good Year », in order to perfect the company's sewing methods.

In 1910, Blanchard represented France at the World Expo in Brussels and was awarded a diploma of honour. In 1926, Eugène Blanchard brought sophistication to a whole new level by creating 5 new widths in the company's shoe sizes, to fit customers' feet perfectly. These custommade shoes are what made Weston a success.

# Aubusson tapestry Water and Wool

## ON UNESCO'S WORLD HERITAGE LIST

Aubusson tapestry is a local tradition, a fine art and a luxurious product. It is the result of five centuries of history and skills in southern Creuse. It is renewed today with contemporary creations. In Aubusson, weavers use horizontal looms known as "basse lisse" looms: this technique involves weaving on the rear side of the tapestry-in-the-making.

Weavers are artistic tradesmen / women whose task is to carry out projects thought up by artists. A great amount of skill is required . Jean Cocteau used to refer to weavers as "harpists", juggling between the art of "textile translation" and the art of colours.

Many famous artists came to work in Aubusson: Dom Robert, Braque, Picasso, Le Corbusier, Léger, Cocteau, Lurçat, Vasarely, Kandinsky, Caldre, Dufy, Toffoli, Folon, the Delaunays, Garouste, Castelbajac, Zadkine, Pifarretti, Sarkis, Mosset, Stella, Bertrand Clément, Opalka... to name a few.

## THE BRAND NEW « CITÉ INTERNATIONALE DE LA TAPISSERIE » INTERNATIONAL TAPESTRY MUSEUM

The "Cité de la Tapisserie" opens on July 10th, 2016 and will greatly contribute to the revival of Aubusson tapestry. Various Aubusson productions will be exhibited here, from major historical works to contemporary ones. La Cité offers visitors a spectacular tour with an original scenography, particularly with its « nef des tentures » (the tapestry hanging nave), a 700m2 multi-purpose cultural venue, built much like a theatre. It will be located in the old Decorative Art School. It will also be a wonderful workplace for young artists and a platform for contemporary creation.

PINTON made a 7 x 3 metres tapestry dedicated to John Lennon, ordered by Amnesty International's founder, Bill Shipsey. It was inaugurated on Ellis Island, in July of 2015, in presence of Yoko Ono, his widow, as well as Bono from U2. It is exhibited at the National Immigration Museum.
