# BE AMAZED

The Ardèche can be summed up in three words: passion, beauty and talent. Prehistoric man came to the region as long as 36,000 years ago and laid the first foundations of art on the walls of the Chauvet-Pont d'Arc Cave, classified as a Unesco World Heritage Site. It took passion and genius to tame the wild and awe-inspiring landscapes of Ardèche, such as the Ardèche Gorges, Mont-Gerbier-de-Jonc and the mountains, and the Eyrieux valley. These little corners of paradise are also part of a precious and fragile local heritage that all who live and work here are more determined than ever to respect and conserve.

Words are not enough to describe Ardèche, you have to experience it, by canoe or kayak, bike or via ferrata, by exploring some of the charming medieval villages perched on the mountainsides or by taking a detour to some of the fortresses that guard over the Rhône Valley and is prestigious wines.

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# **GENERAL INFORMATION**

### Location

Ardèche is located where Provence begins, in the south-east of France, along the river Rhône, a natural border stretching for 135km, between Lyon and Avignon.

Its climate and vegetation are influenced by the Mediterranean Sea in the south of the county and by the Massif Central in the mountainous area in the western part.



### The Pont d'Arc Decorated Cave – the 'Grotte Chauvet' – and the replica site

### 2 million visitors reached in 2019!

Dating back 36,000 years, the extraordinary cave paintings of the Pont d'Arc Decorated Cave – the Grotte Chauvet – are amongst the brightest jewels of humanity. This immense natural cathedral, untouched for millennia, was discovered on December 18 1994 in Ardèche at Vallon Pont d'Arc by three amateur cavers, Jean-Marie Chauvet, Eliette Brunel and Christian Hilaire.

The site combines three characteristics rarely found together – age, quality of images, and the sheer number of artistic representations – 1000 drawings that include 425 animals. Fourteen different species are represented, most of them dangerous animals such as cave

bears, woolly rhinoceros, mammoths and wild cats, and some of them are unique in the history of cave art – a panther, owl, and the lower part of a female body.

The Grotte Chauvet is a unique research resource for scientists from across the world and in June 2014, became the oldest cultural site to be inscribed on UNESCO's World Heritage list. The Ardèche Department Council and the Rhône-Alpes Regional Council are committed to guaranteeing the conservation of the original cave and making the most of its cultural importance to the wider world.

But the cave can never be opened to the general public, so in order to share the treasures of the Grotte Chauvet with as many people as possible, a replica cave – Grotte Chauvet 2 Ardèche – was opened in April 2015 on the cliffs above Vallon-Pont-d'Arc. This exceptional attraction offers a moving journey back 36,000 years through time. In a massive and ground-breaking project, skilled artists painstakingly copied the cave paintings to create an exact copy of the original, perfect in every detail, down to the humidity, smell and temperature.

### The Ardèche Mountains recognised by UNESCO

Only very special places are awarded UNESCO's Geopark label - 111 of them across the whole world and just 5 in France, so the Monts d'Ardèche Park is proud to be one of them. There are three main criteria for inclusion – the preservation of geological riches; awareness of the environment and the landscape; and the development of sustainable local tourism with regard to the geology. With a landscape dating back 500 million years, the Monts d'Ardèche ticks all the boxes – granite countryside, historic reminders of mining activity, thermal and volcanic activity – and 51 'géosites' have been singled out as being of scientific, educational, or aesthetic importance. Amongst them are volcanic peaks, basalt lava flows, and sculpted cliffs – a wonderful landscape to explore on foot, packed with visual curiosities.

It is hard to imagine a more rewarding place to cycle than Ardèche where quiet roads wind through vineyards and lavender fields beneath oak and chestnut trees. Every bend in the road offers new temptations to explore, far from busy towns and traffic. Discover ancient villages, shady forest trails, and imposing castles along some 400km of trails where bikes have priority. Ardèche boasts the first European cycling event with more than 15,000 cyclists from worldwide and the ViaRhôna now part of the Eurovélo network (n°17).

## **MAJOR CYCLING ITINERARIES**



### The Great Mountain Bike Route of the Monts d'Ardèche (315km)

With an ascent of 5,569m and a descent of 4,000m between Saint-Agrève and Les Vans, the Great Mountain Bike Route of the Monts d'Ardèche has been designed for mountain bike touring. This itinerary is 315km long, starting from Annonay to Bourg-St-Andeol, crossing Les Vans. It largely follows the GR7 and GR4, passing through the Massif Central and the Cévennes, and over the famous mounts of Mézenc and Gerbier de Jonc. From Saint-Félicien, a 50km track allows to join the main itinerary. Accessible to all, the trail is clearly marked 'Grande Traversée de l'Ardèche'. **Tip:** a fresh stop at Devesset Lake, accommodation, bathing, windsurfing amongst pine trees.

# The ViaRhôna from Lake Geneva to the Mediterranean:

this cycle route project aims to link Lake Geneva to the Mediterranean by following the Rhône. This 800 km itinerary will pass through the Ardèche and the Drôme. The Ardèche route is 93 km is divided into 4 sections: from Sarras to Glun, from Soyons to La Voulte-sur-Rhône, from Pouzin to Rochemaure and from Viviers to Bourg-St-Andéol.

Discover outstanding feats of engineering such as the first suspension bridges in the north of Ardèche and the new Himalayan-style footbridge built to take the ViaRhôna using the using the supports of the Old Bridge at Rochemaure and to marvel at the remarkable Roman abbey of Cruas.






You don't need to be hugely sporty to tackle the Dolce Via. With a gradient of just 1%, this former railway track in the Eyrieux valley has been given a new lease of life as a trail for walkers, cyclists and mountain bikes stretching for 75 km. The route currently links Saint-Laurent-du-Pape to St-Martin de Valamas and Les Nonières but will eventually join the ViaRhôna at La Voulte and on towards St-Agrève and Lamastre to create a 93km trail. Travel with friends, family or as a couple to explore the Eyrieux valley and enjoy picture-postcard landscapes and fresh, country air.


The former railway tracks, mostly disused since 1968, have become simple trails. However, many remarkable civil engineering works dating from the railway era still remain, and the scenery is nothing short of spectacular. Biking along through this little-known yet magnificent countryside, you will see the distinctive valleys of the Boutières - part of the mountains of Ardèche - from a whole new perspective.

### The Via Ardèche

The gentle Via Ardèche offers ever-changing panoramas across the flat land of South Ardèche, the river valley, and the peaks of the Cévennes. Currently stretching for 44km in two tracks : 32km between Uzer and Grospierres along an old railway track, Spring 2020 will see another 9km added to the route linking Uzer with Vinezac and Balazuc, as well as a further 12km between Beaulieu and St.Paul-le-Jeune.

### La Via Fluvia

The first 10km of the Via Fluvia cycle route between the Loire and the Rhône have just been completed between Annonay and Bourg Argental. And in two years' time, they will connect to the Via Rhôna. Travel back in time as you cycle the trail in the footsteps of famous inventors and be ready for some exceptional natural sites along the way, all set in gentle, green countryside.

### The Payre valley

Initially created in 1861, the Pouzin / Privas railway was the 1st railway line to enter service in Ardèche. At this time Ardèche was among the leading industrial counties of France and the railway allowed the transport of iron ore extracted from the mines in the Privas basin. Reserved for passenger transport by 1910, it was again used to transport local production, before closing altogether in 1994. This old route has many interesting structures: tunnels, viaducts, bridges, footbridges, and hydraulic works. Abandoned in recent decades, this heritage line consequently now needs work and a programme of restoration is now under way. Since summer 2018, the whole itinerary covers 20km and between Privas and Le Pouzin from the ViaRhona junction.

### The 'Voie Bleue' - The 'Blue Trail'

This 12km trail for walkers and cyclists runs alongside the Rhône between Guilherand-Granges and Châteaubourg, and Tournonsur-Rhône soon. Heading towards Guilherand-Granges, users can join the trail just 100m from the ViaRhôna car park at Pont des Lônes, direction Soyons. However the north-bound junction with ViaRhôna for the 2km between Châteaubourg and Glun, is still to be completed. Half the the trail has been resurfaced, the rest covered with tarmac. Most of the trail follows the river bank, passing through an unspoilt natural environment rich in fauna and flora, and car parks and picnic areas along the route provide easy access for everybody.

So whether you want a sporting challenge or a gentle pedal through the countryside, the routes offer something for everyone. ## **NATURE SITES**

### The Ardèche Gorges



A deep, breathtaking "defile", with unexpected, impressive viewpoints, unspoilt, peaceful scenery..., the Ardèche Gorges are known far and wide, thanks to the Pont d'Arc!

This series of sinuous canyons is a superb natural, open-air museum, and a paradise for those who love canoeing.

Since 1932, the 20-mile descent of the Gorges, which includes twenty-five rapids, has been a must for all who wish to enjoy the ultimate in thrills in this challenging sport!

Walkers can complete much the same route in around 12 hours. The Ardèche Gorges tourist route :

At each viewpoint, tourists will find a linear representation of the river and the route engraved in a stone in the ground, as well as a totem indicating the viewpoint name and engraved blocks representing plant and animal species symbolising the Gorges. Tastefully combining stone and metal, these viewpoints are perfectly integrated into the landscape overlooking the Nature Reserve – a real aid to the 1.5 million tourists expected to follow the route each year.

### Le Grand Site 'Combe d'Arc' (2015-2020)

The Ardèche Gorges attract many tourists to the department, in particular the 'Combe d'Arc' which welcomes some 1.5 million visitors a year. Second most visited site in the Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes region after Mont Blanc, it is the fourth most photographed natural space in France.

Now the Combe d'Arc is hoping to be accredited as a Grand Site de France, a label which involves the preservation and management of the most prestigious and most visited national heritage sites. Over several decades, the Combe d'Arc has been used almost exclusively for leisure, to the detriment of the landscape. Visitors aren't able to understand the specific geology of the area, nor its astonishing human history.

The main aim of the Grand Site operation is to once again identify the original meander and river bed in the landscape and regain the views on the Pont d'Arc natural arch. The project therefore has four goals – to restore the splendour of the Pont d'Arc; manage visitor numbers better; enhance the entry points to the Combe d'Arc; and show other ways of discovering the Combe d'Arc. These goals will be achieved by 14 separate elements of the proposed enhancements between now and 2020. So far, the only Grand Site de France, designated in 2004, is the Aven d'Orgnac.

### Gerbier de Jonc – Discovery Centre for the sources of the Loire

France's longest river begins at an altitude of 1,551 metres on the slopes of Gerbier du Jonc. From summer 2018, a visitor centre has opened in a former Touring Club building as part of a complete overhaul of this important mountain site. Geology, volcanoes, and the phenomenon of the watershed are all explained through models, films and displays. Three virtual routes are also laid out within the museum with pop-up effects, films and games to illustrate different themes. Fun, informative and light years away from textbook learning.

### The magical Païolive Wood, Les Vans

One of the strangest natural sites in the Southern Ardèche is the Païolive Wood, a natural maze extending for 16 m<sup>2</sup>. The mix of rock and vegetation gives a wild and mysterious air to this 'Fairy Wood, where white limestone rocks were shaped by rain water in the Jurassic and Cretaceous periods. All ages can have fun looking out for shapes that resemble creatures such as a tortoise and an elephant, a bear, a lion and bird on the nest. Just follow one of the marked paths or the hikers' trail.

# Natural springs and extinct volcanoes

12 million years ago, the Ardèche went through a period of dramatic pyrotechnic activity which created the landscape we see today. Mont Gerbier de Jonc, for instance, source of the Loire, was created during an eruption, the lava transformed into a dome which is known locally as a 'suc' and rises to 1551m. Other basalt peaks also stand out on the horizon, the highest being Mont Mézenc, a pyramidal peak which dominates the watershed line at more than 1754m. Volcanic activity is also captured at the Ray Pic cascade where water pours down 30m over basalt columns, one of the longest lava flows in France. No swimming allowed though! To see a volcanic lake, head to the Lac d'Issarlès where water has filled an ancient crater.

The Park's objective is to provide visitors with high quality tourist facilities, and above all enable them discover the local territory and its heritage and landscapes, giving priority to the shoulder seasons and spreading visitors throughout the whole area, right into the deepest valleys.

# NEW - Take a Tour of the Tanargue - GR<sup>®</sup>de Pays – 63 km in 4 days

Choose a departure date, reserve accommodation on line, and for four days, keen hikers can explore the Massif du Tanargue. The route leaves Largentière and winds along the ridges for 62km, frequently at altitudes higher than 1000m. On the way, pass the panoramic viewpoint at Tour de Brison; the 15th century Gua bridge with its three arches; and the mountain village of Loubaresse, as well as Mont Aigu, a summit of 1316m. Straddling the Watershed Line, the Tanargue offers a mix of mule trails and transhumance tracks, used for centuries by local farmers. # **FOLLOW THE LINE OF THE WATERSHED**

The department of Ardèche is crossed by an invisible line marking the natural watershed that divides water flowing into the Atlantic and the Mediterranean. And since July 2017, artists have been installing commissioned works of art that reflect the countryside, history and craft traditions of the area.

### Chartreuse de Bonnefoy

This ruined abbey surrounded by countryside has become a moving work of art thanks to Stéphane Thidet who has installed giant mirrors in empty windows and doors. Gently angled towards the sky or the soil, they reflect the landscape and bring the observer into the heart of it – a mix of mystery and reality, illusion and reflection.



### Gerbier de Jonc

Film-maker Olivier Leroi has recorded the Loire from a helicopter and the resulting film will be shown on a loop at the new discovery centre at the river's source on the slopes of Gerbier de Jonc. Olivier is also installing a plaque at each one of the mountain springs to represent the fauna and flora that are typical of that spot. Photographers will also be taken every 50 km from the source to the estuary, a portrait of the Loire in 22 pictures.



### Tour de Borne

German artist Gloria Friedmann is known for her minimalist works that invite the onlooker to step inside. Now she is tracing the outline of a lighthouse, a building linked to the Tour de Borne nature observation tower. At the top a 360° panorama in blue will highlight the unique position of this lighthouse on the watershed that links the Atlantic Ocean with the Mediterranean Sea.



### Abbaye de Mazan

This ruined Cistercian abbey has a new lease of life thanks to painter Felice Varini who highlights the architectural elements of a building against a backdrop of the countryside, creating geometric forms. Inspired by the changing light of the Ardèche mountains, Varini is working in gold leaf here at Mazan, and wherever you look, circles will appear, as though resting on the church roof.

### Sagnes et Goudoulet (La Chaumasse) – 'Water Tower' artwork mirrors nature

Innovative landscape gardener and botanist Gilles Clément has created a 'water tower' in homage to the most famous peak in Ardèche, Mont Gerbier de Jonc. Built out of the same volcanic rock as the mountain itself, the conical, hollow tower captures humidity from the air which condenses on the outside walls and is then collected in a basin inside the tower. From here it divides to flow either to the Atlantic or the Mediterranean, just as rainwater flows in either direction here from the natural watershed.



### **Terre Loire**

Now Japanese artist Kôichi Kurita has inaugurated the sixth piece in the cellars of Notre-Dame des Neiges Abbey at St Laurent les Bains. Called Terre Loire, it involves 700 small cups placed on a map of the Loire and its tributaries, each cup containing earth from that precise spot. Find it by taking the GR7 trail on foot or by bike, but also by car, guided by a mock GPS from the Toplamak artists' collective which turns the journey into a fantasy adventure.

### NEW : Seventh artwork to be installed on the Watershed Trail end 2020

'Crystal Cave' by two contemporary artists under the name HeHe will be the seventh outdoor artwork to be installed along the Watershed Trail. This natural mountain ridge determines whether rainfall ends up in the Mediterranean or the Atlantic Ocean. The new piece will stand above the village of St Laurent les Bains along a hiking trail that joins the GR7. It faces towards the Mediterranean, as opposed to 'Terre Loire' by Kôichi Kurita which faces the Atlantic. 'Crystal Cave' was inspired by the old fluorite mines and their interaction with natural water, and will be in place late this year.

# THE SECRET WORLD OF CAVES

At the end of the 121-metre circuit, the magnificent 'nave' is showcased in an unforgettable sound and light show before visitors are whisked back to ground level in a lift. 

Clinging bravely to the mountainside or hidden in valley bottoms, these villages glow gold in the southern sun. Tiny streets run between ancient houses with stone slab roofs that blend perfectly with the wild hills and flower-covered balconies shimmer in the crystal clear waters of the mountain torrents.

These are truly exquisite villages, each with its own distinctive character. The 21 listed villages are : Ailhon, Alba-la-Romaine, Antraigues, Balazuc, Banne, Beauchastel, Boucieu-le-Roi, Chalencon, Chassiers, Désaignes, Jaujac, Labeaume, Meyras, Naves, Rochemaure, St-Laurent-sous-Coiron, St-Montan, St-Vincent-de-Barrès, Thueyts, Vinezac and Vogüé.

### NEW - Saint Laurent sous Coiron awarded Character Village label



Perched like an eagle's nest with 360° panoramic views over the Ardèche plain and mountains, Saint-Laurent-sous-Coiron is the highest of the department's character villages, situated on the basalt Coiron plateau that links the Col de l'Escrinet to the Rhône. Its own micro-climate results in a green landscape with hedges and trees, ideal for dairy farming, and several local sites are proof of human presence since ancient times, including cave houses in the basalt cliffs at Les Balmes de Montbrun.

A few traces remain of the old ramparts, the village dominated by the ruins of the castle, whilst down below, the parish church boasts a beautiful Romanesque door. Other ruins include a square building from around the 12th century. Local limestone and basalt are evident in many historic buildings, the varying shades creating a chequerboard effect.



### NEW in Labeaume, village with character, Mas Sophia, handmade soap made from plants

After living abroad for several years, Pascale Chauvel returned to her roots in Ardèche and opened a small craft soap business in Labeaume using extracts of plants. Here in the south of Ardèche, she grows species that don't need a lot of water - lavender and rosemary, sage and bay - and makes soap using essential oils from her home-grown plants. Among her specialities is soap produced from silk cocoons and thyme flowers, using cocoons given to her by the Silk Worm Museum in Lagorce. A happy coincidence, given that Pacale's home is a former silk worm farm!

### Cité de la Préhistoire where prehistory comes to life

Take a voyage back in time from the Paleolithic Era to the Iron Age at the Aven d'Orgnac in southern Ardèche, a designated Grand Site de France. 



## Meet Raphaël Pommier – organic winemaker and now restaurateur at Bourg-Saint-Andéol

Owner of the Domaine Notre Dame de Cousignac at Bourg-Saint- Andéol in the Rhône Valley, Raphaël Pommier is also something of an entrepreneur, offering chambre d'hôte accommodation and also, since May 2019, an on-site bistro, La Table du Vigneron which reopens for the season in April. Young chef Laurent Rigaill creates simple dishes using organic raw materials from local producers, but with his own signature flair. Try goat terrine with basil jelly, for instance, or tarte tatin with thyme and lemon. 'He cooks at low temperature and his sauces are extraordinary,' says Raphaël. 'Dishes are prepared in our old barn and the bistro is a gourmet stopover in the heart of the vineyards with a shady outdoor terrace, wooden benches, and upturned barrels for eating standing up. Inside we have stone walls and wooden beams. Real rustic chic!'

Raphaël is a keen cook himself and an organic bistro seemed a natural addition to his wine tourism activities. He sees his own job as an organic winemaker as being very similar to that of a chef, mixing flavours and refining the product to please the client's palate. Soon he hopes to run evenings at his cellar with wine tasting and local tapas, inviting winemakers from different parts of the département to showcase their own products. 'Wine exists to emphasise the taste of a dish. And like music that is all around us, it must accompany us but never deafen us,' says Raphaël.

# Florian Biscop, restaurateur in Saint-Péray

# NEW: 'Tanargue' – Whisky from Ardèche

Inspired by a trip to Scotland, whisky-loving friends François Papin and Cédric Ollier made a rash bet to create their own whisky in Ardèche using nothing but local ingredients. After a first distillation in 2017, they had to wait three years for it to age in oak barrels before they can sell it in 2020 under the name of an Ardèche massif. Wanting to produce the best possible product, François and Cédric approached carefully selected local partners for each stage of the production process, guaranteeing a wealth of aromatic notes to please the palates of whisky fans.

**Just for the record:** Essential to the production of Tanargue whisky are Ardèche barley, local water, and fire for the distillation. The mountainous Tanargue is where naturel elements come together: up to 2000mm of rain falls each year on the rocky slopes, which are frequently struck by lightning. Taranis – god of the sky and storms – often makes his presence felt on the 'arga' (mountain), hence Tanargue means Mountain of Thunder in local Celtic mythology.




# **ACCOMMODATION AMIDST THE VINEYARDS**

# Winemaker creates unique vintage with the help of Debussy and a classical quartet

Four men with musical instruments have been – well – instrumental in helping a Rhône Valley wine maker produce a wine with a difference. Accord Tonique is the brainchild of Raphaël Pommier at Bourg-Saint-Andéol created to publicise the new AOC Côtes du Rhoône Villages Saint-Andéol, and celebrate 20 years of the Cordes en Ballade festival. Raphaël asked the Debussy Quartet to play amongst the vineyards during the manual harvest. He then played their last album around the clock for three weeks during fermentation, the classical music bringing a specific vibration to the maceration of the wine which is made with no added sulphides. The wine is then filtered very slowly into ceramic containers and bottled quickly for a natural result.

# 'AOP Châtaigne d'Ardèche', the 'Queen of Ardèche'

Flourishing well in the local climate, the chestnut tree has forged the identity of the Ardèche across the centuries, and is still important today to the local agricultural economy and associated industries. So local producers were determined to gain AOP recognition for the Ardèche chestnut. Now this important quality label protects three different products – fresh chestnuts, dried chestnuts and chestnut flour – and all stages of production take place under AOP criteria according to traditional methods.

More than 65 varieties are grown here, making Ardèche the No 1 French department for chestnuts – Bouche Rouge, Pourette, Comballe, Sardonne, Précoce des Vans to name a few. Every link in the chain - from the tree to transformation into other products - is carried out locally in an industry that employs around 1 000 full-time workers.

Most famous and most delicate of all the chestnut products is the gourmet marron glacé. From its artisan beginnings, production moved onto an industrial scale in 1882 with the creation of Ets Faugier, followed in 1907 by Sabaton and in 1920 by Imbert.
