From romantic parks and intimate covered passages to evocative settings and sumptuous hotels, the city is the perfect place for a romantic escape, whether you're in the heady stages of new love or a long-term couple.

SECRET ROUTES TO DISCOVER EACH OTHER

Draw up a lovey-dovey itinerary

For a first stroll as a couple in Paris, pick up a map of the city and follow ‘inspiring’ street names. You could start at the **Passage du Désir**, in the 10th arrondissement, and then on to **Rue de la Fidélité**, only a short distance away, leading to ... **Rue de Paradis!** Or you could walk down **Rue de la Gaieté** (14th) and **Rue de la Félicité** (17th). Newlyweds could explore **Rue Monsieur** (7th) and go on to **Rue Mademoiselle** (15th) before joining **Rue Madame** (6th), and perhaps continue on to the nearby **Rue Princesse**. To put an end to a lovers’ quarrel, what could be better than a peaceful stroll along **Rue de la Paix**? In love, the language of flowers is particularly eloquent, and some secret corners of Paris are evocatively named. Take a walk along the **Quai aux Fleurs** (4th), **Rue des Rosiers** (4th), then **Rue des Camélias** (14th), before losing yourself in the utterly charming **Cité des Fleurs** (17th). More flower-themed streets: **Rue des Glycines**, **Rue des Iris** and **Rue des Orchidées** (13th), **Rue des Primevères** (11th) and **Boulevard des Capucines** (9th).

Romantic visits, with or without a guide

Allow yourself time to discover the romantic city streets with your sweetheart. A stroll can be instructive with *Paris as You Like It*: the tour guide takes visitors around the French capital’s most iconic monuments. Delphine Lanvin offers walks in the footsteps of famous Parisian couples. Suggestive paintings, sensual sculptures, cheeky bronze statues: museums have many a work of art to make visitors blush. Tour guide Philippe takes visitors on a tour of a hidden aspect to the city - its former brothels. Instant Tours is happy to loan photography enthusiasts a vintage Polaroid camera during their tour. With Meet My Spots, couples get expert advice from a professional photographer while taking a guided tour. In the Nouvelle Athènes district, the Musée de la Vie Romantique houses a collection of souvenirs and objects relating to the writer George Sand and the painter Ary Scheffer. Other romantic icons: the Lady and the Unicorn tapestry at the Musée de Cluny and the painting of Romeo and Juliet at the Musée Delacroix.

Explore the covered shopping arcades

With their high glass roofs and quaint boutiques, the covered arcades of Paris are full of timeless charm. They are perfect for a romantic stroll away from the noise of the city, especially on rainy days. The most opulent ones are **Galerie Vivienne** and **Galerie Colbert**, with their neo-classical decor. Jean Paul Gaultier was one of the first people to open a shop in Galerie Vivienne. The **Passage des Panoramas** has been nicknamed ‘the passage of the palate’ because it has plenty of places to eat: there’s a bistro, a Michelin-starred restaurant, a tea room and a wine bar. **Passage Jouffroy** and **Passage Verdeau** will delight those in search of collector’s items and great little secret places. At the far end of Passage Jouffroy, the charming Hôtel Chopin with its old-fashioned decor offers a superb view over the rooftops of Paris - the ideal hideaway for a romantic weekend. The **Passage du Grand Cerf** and the **Galerie Véro-Dodat** are magnets for design fans. The **Passage Choiseul** is a popular spot to linger, and the **Passage Brady** takes visitors on a voyage of the senses with its numerous Indian restaurants. The **Cour du commerce Saint-André**, an open-air passage, is home to many secrets and historical details dating to the French Revolution, as well as Paris’s oldest café the Procope, a favourite haunt of the French Enlightenment’s great thinkers. Enjoy a break and a bite to eat in the different arcades - especially **Beaupassage**, where you’ll find restaurants from celebrity French chefs and many artisan food producers.

Secret Paris streets

People around the world are familiar with the usual pictures and clichéd images of romance in Paris, but lovebirds in search of tranquillity will find plenty of romantic spots off the beaten track. **Rue des Thermopyles**, a cobblestone street, is an oasis of calm and greenery in the 14th arrondissement, offering a glimpse of a bucolic side to Paris, like the **Cité Florale** in the 13th, where even the street names - Orchidées, Volubilis, Mimosas, Glycines, Iris, Liserons - evoke the fragrance of flowers. **Rue Crémieux**, a stone's throw from the Gare de Lyon, provides a colourful excursion for people with a taste for the unusual. And then there's the **Square de Montsouris**, formerly inhabited by several artists, with its houses draped in wisteria and ivy. Enjoy the birds singing in some of the city's more unspoilt sites, such as the **Mouzaïa district**, in the 19th arrondissement, or the **Campagne à Paris** (the countryside in Paris), rue Jules Siegfried, in the 20th. The houses are tucked away at the end of small gardens and ivy covers the wooden doors and shutters.

ROMANTIC WALKS

The most beautiful views of Paris

The best viewpoints are for sharing with your loved one. The most famous is the one from the square in front of the **Sacré-Cœur** basilica, at the top of Montmartre hill. In eastern Paris, the hill at **Belleville** also offers a spectacular view. From the 56th floor of the **Tour Montparnasse**, the Ciel de Paris restaurant high above the capital offers amazing moments. Only the **Eiffel Tower** is higher - so high, in fact, that you'll sometimes literally have your head in the clouds. Great views are also guaranteed as you travel up the glass-walled escalators at the Pompidou Centre. At the top, you can carry on enjoying the vista and watch the sun setting over the city as you sip a drink at **Chez Georges**, the restaurant on the top floor of the modern art museum. Note to

the intrepid: the tethered hot air balloon at the **Parc André Citroën** takes you up into the sky to hover over the park from a height of 150 metres. The **Terrass Hotel** rooftop affords another viewpoint over the city from this part of Montmartre. The narrow streets winding from Place du Tertre offer spectacular views of Paris, and the little-known **Butte Bergeyre** in the 19th arrondissement stands right opposite the Sacré Cœur. Strolling through the **Parc des Buttes Chaumont** feels like walking on the city's rooftops, as if on a tightrope. **La Défense** is an area with less warmth, but with a fabulous view of the Arc de Triomphe in the distance. You can also see this contemporary district from the **Fondation Vuitton** terraces, along with the green hills around the outskirts of Paris.

Legendary bridges and footbridges for sharing a lingering kiss

Bridges can also be very romantic! Maybe because the arch symbolises an alliance, or because water will carry away even the craziest promises ... Tradition dictates that those in love should kiss while making a wish on the Pont Marie, nicknamed the Lovers' Bridge. Even if you're not in love, you still have 37 bridges and 49 pedestrian footbridges across the Seine to choose from!

The **Bichat pedestrian footbridge** (10th) is a great place to stand hand in hand and watch the barges perform their ballet while the locks fill on the Canal Saint-Martin. The **Pont au Double** (4th), which links the square in front of Notre Dame to Quai de Montebello, is ideal for losing yourself in thought while gazing at the Seine riverbanks. The **Rue de Crimée lift bridge** (19th) affords a lovely view over the Bassin de la Villette Ourcq Canal. Crossing the Arsenal Marina on the **Mornay footbridge** (7th and 12th) with your loved one, you may even be tempted to cast off and sail away together... The **BZ/12 footbridge** (12th) on the Coulée Verte spans the garden known as Jardin de Reuilly: the perfect spot to stretch out for a siesta on warm days.

Romantic green spaces

Nature lovers will be in seventh heaven in Paris's many parks. With 106 huge statues, bandstands where musicians perform in fine weather, and superb gardens, the Jardin du Luxembourg inspires couples to get lost in delightful reverie. The famous Fontaine de Médicis is the perfect spot to declare your love. Created by the painter Carmontelle in the 18th century, the Parc Monceau is a shrine to Paris romance. It is filled with secret spots where lovers can hide away, and a little bridge on which to exchange languorous kisses. The Parc des Buttes Chaumont feels like the countryside in Paris and has many romantic features: little streams, magnificent waterfalls, a big lake and a viewpoint at the top of the hill. After a boat ride on the Lac Daumesnil, couples can pay homage to their love at the Temple de l'Amour. The Roseraie is an inviting place for a leisurely stroll amid a sea of roses. For a brisk walk with your lover, the Coulée Verte, a 4.5-km walkway through gardens, parks, trees and plants, is just the place. A perennial source of inspiration for painters, writers, filmmakers and singers, the banks of the Marne River are very romantic: you can walk or cycle along the banks, try to spot plants and animals on the islands, which are protected nature reserves, admire the holiday villas along the river, sip a glass of white wine in one of the famous open-air *guinguettes*, or take to the water together in a two-person canoe or kayak.

Poetic itineraries

Sometimes it's enough to just walk around the city and soak up the romantic atmosphere of Paris. Couples setting off hand in hand to admire the finest Parisian monuments should start with the view from the Arc de Triomphe. Then head along the Champs-Elysées, the world's most beautiful avenue - a memorable stroll. A quick detour to the Musée Jacquemart-André is highly recommended. This superb Second Empire townhouse houses a rich collection of paintings, furniture, frescoes and tapestries dating to that era. Continue on to the Grand Palais to admire its magnificent nave, then make your way to the majestic Place de la Concorde. Only a few metres on, you will come to the beautiful Tuileries Gardens designed by André Le Nôtre, the undisputed master of the formal French garden. For a shot of culture in the area, you can choose between the Musée de l'Orangerie and its collection of Monet masterpieces or the temporary exhibitions at the Jeu de Paume. And of course the world's greatest museum welcomes all history and art lovers - no romantic break in Paris would be complete without a visit to the Louvre. Not far away is the Marais with its narrow, pedestrian-only streets: a district of choice for a stroll with your loved one. The secretive and authentic atmosphere of the area

transports lovers straight to the 17th century. This is where you'll find the Musée Picasso and the Musée Carnavalet, but also the Maison de Victor Hugo, an emblem of the French Romantic movement, on Place des Vosges. It would be hard to find a more romantic and poetic spot than this square flanked by sumptuous townhouses and beautiful arcades, with a lovely garden in the middle. Up in the northern part of the city, Montmartre Hill is popular with lovers for its bohemian atmosphere, which makes for an enchanting stroll. A stone's throw from the Sacré-Cœur Basilica, the Montmartre cemetery is a must-see where you can walk among the tombs of famous French people such as Stendhal, Berlioz and Dalida. Then make your way to Avenue Junot to admire the art deco mansions and the charming street known as Villa Léandre. Stop off at the Musée Montmartre and linger in its lovely Renoir Gardens. Next door, you'll find the characteristic Moulin de la Galette, a former windmill. The 'I Love You' wall has nearly 1,000 declarations of love in more than 300 languages. In the daytime, couples can have their portrait sketched by the artists on Place du Tertre, or their initials embroidered on an offcut at the Marché Saint-Pierre. Every year, during the harvest festival, couples can publicly pledge their commitment during the annual 'Non-Marriage Proposals' ceremony conducted by the Mayor.

ROMANTIC MODES OF TRANSPORT

Cruises on the Seine

There's nothing quite as romantic as inviting your beloved for a dinner cruise or sightseeing cruise along the Seine to admire Paris's most beautiful monuments. The restaurant boats of La Marina de Paris serve refined cuisine made from fresh market produce, and the Bateaux Parisiens offer outstanding views from their all-glass dining room - not forgetting the famous Bateaux-Mouches®. The *guinguette* (open-air dance hall) spirit has reached the Seine with the Belle Vallée, a paddle-boat with an accordionist on board every Thursday for a lively musical boat trip. Cruises along the Canal Saint-Martin, passing through locks and swing bridges, will appeal to those eager to spot reminders of bygone popular and bohemian Paris. The yacht Joséphine offers a unique experience: a romantic dinner followed by an entire night on board, on the Seine, with a fantastic view of the Eiffel Tower from the Jacuzzi on the roof. Vedettes du Pont Neuf organizes concerts on the Seine and champagne-tasting cruises, for musical moments and sparkling fun!

Restaurants with a difference

It's not for nothing that Paris is synonymous with unparalleled gastronomic experiences. Couples in search of new and unique flavours will easily find ways to satisfy their curiosity. Dans le Noir is a restaurant where lovers can try out the unusual experience of dining in total darkness. All your other senses will come alive! For a romantic dinner in an amazing setting, head to the Blue Elephant with its Thai village atmosphere complete with little bridges, lush plants and tinkling fountains. Nature lovers will enjoy a picnic on the banks of the Canal Saint-

Martin or in one of the city's many parks and gardens. And, for a typically Parisian vibe, there's nothing like the charm of an old-fashioned *guinguette*. In the heart of the Buttes Chaumont park, the *guinguette*-style cafe Rosa Bonheur, housed in a listed building, is a very popular spot for dancing on fine summer evenings along with people from the local area. A short distance from the Pont Alexandre III, the fixed barge named 'Rosa Bonheur sur Seine' is a great place to relax. Even more unusual, the Chalet des Îles, on the banks of a lake in the Bois de Boulogne, offers a bucolic setting in summer and a cosy setting in winter with its lovely fireplace. Nearby, visitors can venture onto the île de la Jatte in Neuilly-sur-Seine for dinner at the very traditional Guinguette de Neuilly, or the restaurant 'Les Pieds dans l'eau', which has an enormous terrace overlooking the Seine. If you're looking for a really unusual place to have a drink, go to Maison Souquet. Formerly a bordello in the heart of the Pigalle district, it is now a boutique hotel with a secret cocktail bar and sumptuous 'Salon of 1001 Nights'. Another charming place for an intimate rendezvous is the beautiful garden of the Grande Mosquée de Paris, where you can share an Oriental pastry and a pot of mint tea. The über-stylish OFF Paris Seine is a floating hotel/bar on the Seine that even offers the luxury of a pool to dip your feet in on days when you want to cool off. A lime green barge called Petit Bain moored just below the French National Library (BnF, Bibliothèque Nationale de France,) houses a floating cultural centre, where you can enjoy electro music in the concert hall and an open-air bar.

Restaurants with a view and rooftops

In Paris, there is no shortage of restaurants with a view. The Eiffel Tower is obviously a must-do. At a height of 125 metres, the Jules Verne restaurant with its gastronomic menu by Alain Ducasse provides a panoramic view of the city. The Tour d'Argent, overlooking the Seine and Notre-Dame Cathedral, needs no introduction. Designed by Philippe Starck, the bar of the Kong on the 5th floor of a Haussmannian building offers a superb view of the Pont Neuf and the Seine. Wonderful vistas of Paris can also be had from the terrace of the Maison Blanche gastronomic restaurant, the rooftop/terrace restaurant Les Ombres at the Musée du Quai Branly, the Georges at the Pompidou Centre, the Lebanese restaurant Zyriad by Noura on the top floor of the Institut du Monde Arabe, and the 39V in the heart of Paris's 'Golden Triangle' district. A number of Paris hotels also have wonderful restaurants tucked away on their rooftops. The top floor of the Hotel Raphaël has a restaurant and bar with a sweeping view over Paris rooftops. And the Benkay is a gem of Japanese cooking on the 4th floor of the Hôtel Novotel Paris Tour Eiffel. Le Ciel de Paris on the 56th floor of the Tour Montparnasse lords it

over the city. Among the rooftops popular with Parisians in summer are the various branches of the Perchoir, including the one on top of the Gare de l'Est under the Eiffel half-rose window, the Perchoir Marais with its cosy winter terrace and the one on the rooftop of an industrial building near the trendy Oberkampf district with a view of the Sacré-Cœur basilica. The 43 Cockail Bar at the Holiday Inn Paris-Notre Dame offers one of the most spectacular views of Paris, to be enjoyed in warm weather. A hanging garden ('jardin suspendu') and green roof on the rooftop of a big car park is one of the city's latest such spots.

On the Montmartre hillside, you will find the champagne bar and fine deli La Dégustation, a wonderful place for wine-lovers to stop off and taste the offerings of an extensive menu alongside the capital’s connoisseurs.
